I am Patryk and I did my internship at ZHAW, at R&D department in Winterthur.

1. What are you proud of?

I'm proud of myself that I made this internship abroad and I did well at work. I'm really happy that my supervisor appreciated my work and also I'm so grateful for him, because he gave me demanding tasks and I had to think a lot (a bit struggling as well) about solutions. 3. In which ways does Switzerland differ from your home country?

There are plenty of differences in comparison to Poland. Switzerland is so clean, I mean streets, pavements and so on. Trains are always on time and you don't have to bother about 6 minutes train change at the station because you will make it easily. In Poland streets are not so clean and trains are usually delayed. Also in Poland we don't have coffee breaks during the work (and also including our work time) and we have only 1 lunch break which is included.

In addition, in Poland we are working 8 hours per day, not 8,4 hours. Moreover, in Switzerland after accomplished some goals at work, there is Apero and we don't have it in Poland that often (usually once a year).
