My internship in Argoscope


In February 2022 I saw the offer for an internship at the Agricultural research facility of the Swiss Government. Short after I applied since I was always interested in getting more knowledge in Agriculture but until then never had the time for it. After the summer months I got some more indoor computerwork. I assisted different people in different tasks, mainly connected to Excel and Data analysis. It was not too demanding, but I still learned some stuff and I was happy that I could help! Because of my studies I have some knowledge in soils and water content in soils. Therefore, I could also help with a project where we analysed and evaluated different soils sensors.
