IAESTE Internship at Awa Nutrition, Ecuador, May – November 2022

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Before applying, I knew that I wanted to go to Latin America to learn Spanish and combine this with working within my field. I studied Food Science at ETH and just graduated at that time from my Masters. I got my first choice from internships I applied to and was more than happy about it. Before I flew to Quito (Ecuador's capital), I had an interview with my managers and was already contacted by the local IAESTE team. All in all, I didn't know exactly what to expect but was very open to the whole experience. On site, I was welcomed by IAESTE and brought to my accommodation. I stayed with an older lady, without other IAESTE interns. My office was in walking distance to the apartment. At the beginning of my internship there were not so many other interns from IAESTE and so I rather did activities with people from my work. There were also protests going on for 3 weeks forcing us to stay at home – welcome to South America! After a few months, trips were organized by IAESTE and I met amazing people from Europe and North America.

Work Experience

I was in Ecuador much longer than anyone else who came there with IAESTE, so I was able to have my own project and take on responsibility. My role was within research and development but I also learned a lot in the areas of regulatory, sensory science and marketing. We had great times at work and music was playing all day long!

Experience of being abroad
